Code of Conduct for Junior Members

In order to ensure everyone has an enjoyable time at St. Neot Taverners Cricket Club there are a few rules that junior members are asked to stick to, this is the player's code of conduct.

- **HAVE FUN**, winning is not everything
- **COACHES** coach
- **PLEASE DO NOT** shout in anger
- **ABUSE** in any form, either verbal, physical or racial is not acceptable
- **PLEASE** put your litter in the bin or take it home
- **SWEARING** is not permitted
- **RESECT** the coaches, umpire and other helpers
- **BE PROUD** of your club and act in a responsible way when representing St. Neot Taverners in matches

St. Neot Taverners Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with Kate Young, our club Welfare Officer.

As a member of St. Neot Taverners Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and matches or inform their coach/match manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit:
 - When batting, pads, box, gloves and helmet
 - When fielding wicket keeper, pads, gloves and helmet
 - For training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/match manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on club premises or whilst representing the club
